- ◆ Active unencumbered RN licensure
- ◆ Prerequisite course in statistics
- ◆ Two letters of recommendation
- ◆ Minimum 3.0 cumulative GPA preferred
- ◆ Resume and 2 essays
- ◆ TOEFL as appropriate
- ◆ No GRE required
